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

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HOW DO I EXIT MY LEASE?

Signing a commercial lease agreement is a significant step for any business, but sometimes circumstances dictate early termination.

Understanding Your Lease

A clear understanding of the lease terms is crucial, so have your lawyer explain anything you are not clear about. In most instances early termination is not a standard option.

Landlords are not obliged to provide early release to a tenant and generally expect the tenant will perform their side of the agreement. <u>Landlords regularly</u> <u>enforce the tenant's obligations</u> e.g. the obligation to pay the rent until the end of the agreed term.

Mutual Agreement

The most straightforward way to exit a lease is by agreement between you and the landlord. If your landlord will negotiate on termination, then terms can be documented in a deed of surrender, setting out the agreed-upon terms, including financial settlements, any outstanding payments, and property handover details.

Assignment

Assigning your lease involves transferring your lease



to a new tenant who assumes your obligations. Depending on the terms of your lease and whether you have provided any personal guarantees or other security you may remain liable if the new tenant defaults, and in most cases landlord approval will be required.

Breach by Landlord

If your landlord breaches the lease agreement you may have grounds for termination. However, termination is not generally the first option to remedy a landlord breach so you must seek legal advice.

Conclusion

Exiting a commercial lease can be complex and needs to be approached methodically and with caution. Negotiating with your landlord or finding a tenant to step into your shoes are often the preferred methods for early termination.

The multi-million-dollar global business Douglas Pharmaceuticals may be a fantastic New Zealand success story. However, first and foremost it's a homegrown West Auckland success story.

Based in Henderson, the business was the brainchild of Te Atatū South chemist Sir Graeme Douglas, who started in 1967 by creating a cough syrup called Kofsin. Demand soon took off, and Graeme had to turn to manufacturing to maintain enough supply. The company also started importing specialist drugs and repackaging them before distributing them to other pharmacies.

From these humble beginnings, Douglas Pharmaceuticals evolved into the national and international powerhouse it is today.

The company is still family-owned. Graeme's son, Jeff, is now at the helm, while granddaughter Katherine heads up the consumer division. According to Jeff, he joined the business by accident. 'I started part-time in the warehouse as a student in the late 1970s, and I just sort of fell into full-time positions mainly as a sales rep in those early days,' he says.

Jeff took over as Managing Director in 2014 following his father's retirement. Jeff's childhood home was on Jaemont Avenue, opposite his dad's pharmacy, and he



still considers himself a proud Westie.

The company opened its commanding headquarters in 1985. R&D, pharmaceutical manufacturing, and a state-of-the-art innovation centre all work out of the Henderson site. The company also has a large manufacturing facility in Fiji.

Today, we have around 700 employees and export to over 40 countries,' Jeff proudly declares.

Alongside the extensive range of prescription medicines, Douglas is responsible for the Clinicians and Phloe consumer brands. The company is also the world's largest supplier of generic isotretinoin, a molecule primarily used to treat skin conditions.

'Seventy per cent of our turnover is in exports,' advises Jeff. The company's largest market is the lucrative US one. The US is always on the radar first,' says Jeff. 'And we can manufacture and develop products for the US and take it through the regulatory process,' he adds.

Innovation is in the company's DNA. Jeff advises that Douglas collaborates with innovative partners to research, develop, and manufacture prescription, nutraceutical, and consumer healthcare products.

Getting products to market is a long, drawn-out process. It takes at least six years to get a product on pharmacy shelves, including formulation to clinical trials, manufacture, and regulatory approval.

Jeff and his team are passionate about what they do and the difference they make. 'Our products do a lot of significant good for people, so that's very satisfying,' declares Jeff. He adds that making a positive difference in healthcare outcomes for people around the globe is the company's driving force.

People are important to Douglas Pharmaceuticals. The company is a significant local employer that values its workers. 'Every day, our team of 700 innovates,

collaborates, and grows within a company that prioritises people, providing support and challenges to help them achieve their best work,' advises Jeff.

Employees benefit from a first-class working environment and comprehensive benefits package. It's no surprise that the Douglas People & Culture team was recognised as the HR Team of the Year for organisations with over 500 staff at the 2023 HRD New Zealand Awards.

Community is just as important as people to Douglas Pharmaceuticals. Sir Graeme was knighted in 2010 for his services to philanthropy and athletics. And the Douglas Charitable Trust has made giving back to the community an integral part of the company's culture.

'One of our remits is to support the people of West Auckland and worthwhile causes,' declares Jeff. Among others, the Trust is a long-term supporter of Hospice West Auckland and, through the Well Foundation, contributed to the development of Waitākere Hospital's special care baby unit.

The Trust is also a supporter of the Graeme Dingle Foundation, which makes a difference for local rangatahi through mentoring and youth development programmes. Sir Graeme was an enthusiastic supporter of athletics. And that work continues with The Trusts Arena's Douglas Track and Field Stadium.

Jeff is excited about the future of Douglas Pharmaceuticals even though he can see challenges ahead.

'Our industry's changing almost by the day, and the technology change is immense,' he advises. 'When I started in this company, we had a telex machine, and then fax machines came along and revolutionised everything. These days, of course, they virtually don't exist,' jokes Jeff. Now, the company is grappling with big issues like the impact of Al. Furthermore, Jeff says the company wants to keep developing unique products that improve people's lives and meet unmet needs. However, doing so is becoming more and more expensive.

'Now we're into the development of patented products, the phase three clinical trials for our anti-depressant product, for example, will cost US\$150k alone,' Jeff reports. He says Douglas doesn't have the capacity to fund that and will have to find funding partners. 'A relatively small NZ company like ours has to look at outside capital,' he advises, which will be a major focus going forward.

Jeff is also optimistic about the future of business out West. 'When you scratch under the surface of Henderson, you find some wonderful organisations doing really transforming work,' he suggests. One of the best ways to connect with other businesses is to go along to the BA5 events. You meet a hell of a lot of talent that you don't realise exists in this part of Auckland.'

BABICH WINES EXPANDS Sauvignon Blanc Production with New Marlborough Vineyard

Babich Wines, one of New Zealand's oldest familyowned wineries, is increasing its Sauvignon Blanc production by partnering with Craigmore Sustainables on the development of a new vineyard in Marlborough.

Known as Cat Creek, the property covers 418 hectares, with nearly 200 hectares to be dedicated to cultivating Sauvignon Blanc vines when fully developed. Craigmore will invest more than NZD \$40 million in the development over the next two years, with Babich Wines responsible for the management and development of the vineyard.

Once mature, the vineyard site will produce an additional 3,000 tonnes of grapes for the winery with an export value of more than NZD \$20 million, helping meet the growing demand for Babich's portfolio of premium New Zealand wines across domestic and international markets.

Babich Wines CEO David Babich says developments of this size are rare in Marlborough considering the increasingly limited amount of high quality and viable vineyard land remaining.

"Securing more growing capacity for Sauvignon Blanc

is strategically critical for Babich Wines as Marlborough approaches its capacity limits. This partnership with Craigmore provides a timely increase in production capacity and stability of supply, and allows us to retain a high level of control over the entire production process. This is critical in helping us to increase supply to meet

growing global demand, while maintaining the high quality our customers expect."

The joint venture with Craigmore Sustainables, a New Zealand-owned and operated food and fibre investment company, is the first viticulture venture in the Marlborough region for Craigmore.

Craigmore's General Manager Horticulture Con Williams says the move to Marlborough provides diversification for the business and an initial footprint into the region that can be expanded in coming years.



"Marlborough is globally recognised as having regional attributes well-suited for viticulture and the Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc story continues to provide strong long-term fundamentals that make further expansion attractive."

Babich Wines is also upgrading its Marlborough winery facilities to support this new initiative, with additional intake infrastructure, technology and tank capacity.

The investment will increase processing capacity to accommodate the new vineyard's output, ensuring the winery can handle the additional grape supply while continuing to uphold the quality standards the winery is known for.

To ensure your cut peonies last as long as possible, here are a few key care tips to follow:

Harvesting the Perfect Peony: Cut peonies at the right stage of maturity. If you're picking them yourself, aim to cut peonies when the buds are still "softly" closed—just before they fully open.

This stage ensures the blooms will last longer in a vase, slowly opening over time.

Trim the Stems Properly: When bringing peonies inside, immediately re-cut the stems at a 45-degree angle under water. This helps prevent air from entering the stem, which can block water uptake. Use a sharp knife or pruning shears to avoid crushing the stem.

Water, Water, Water: Peonies are thirsty flowers! Place your cut blooms in a clean vase filled with cool water right away. You can also add floral preservative if you have it, but plain water works just fine. Ensure the water level is high enough to submerge the stems completely.



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Keep Them Cool: Peonies prefer a cool environment, so keep them in a spot away from direct sunlight or heat sources like radiators or stoves. Too much heat can cause them to wilt quickly, so aim for a well-lit but cooler area.

Changing the Water: To extend the life of your cut peonies, change the water every two days and re-cut the stems slightly each time. This keeps the water fresh and helps the stems take in more water.

Handling Open Blooms: As peonies open, they become more delicate. If your peonies start to wilt prematurely, try placing the entire stem in cool water for several hours. This can help the blooms revive somewhat, though their lifespan may still be limited.

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MEASLES IN NEW ZEALAND High Risk of an Outbreak

Measles is a serious illness caused by the measles virus that lives in the nose and throat of an infected person. Measles can cause serious complications in children and adults.


How does measles spread?

The measles virus spreads easily through the air by sneezing, coughing or even just talking and breathing. It's one of the most infectious viruses there is. Measles can also be spread by contact with surfaces contaminated with an infected person's nose and throat secretion (nasal mucus & saliva). If you're not immune, and you've been in the same room as someone with measles, you are very likely to catch it. It can stay in the air for about 1 hour.

What are the symptoms of measles?

Symptoms usually take about 7-10 days to appear after you've caught the virus. If you get measles symptoms, always call your medical practice or hospital and tell them before visiting.





Usual symptoms in the first few days of being unwell.

- Fever (temperature above 38°C)
- Running nose (or blocked nose)
- Cough
- Loss of appetite
- Sore and Watery pink eyes
- You may also get white spots inside your mouth

3 to 7 days after the first symptoms people start to develop a rash

- The rash starts on your head or face, often at your hairline or behind your ears, then spreads to your body and then to your arms and legs.

- You usually feel most unwell a day or two after the appearance of the rash.
- The rash will fade about a week, leaving a slight mark on the skin, but this won't be permanent.
- You are no longer at risk of passing on measles to others 4 days after you developed your rash.

Who is at risk of getting measles?

- You are considered to be at risk of getting measles if you were born after 1 January 1969 AND:
- Have not had measles before
- Have not had 2 doses of the MMR Vaccine at or after
- 12 months of age
- Aren't sure if you've had the MMR Vaccine

DATE SCONES A Team Favourite

Scone mix:

- 500g self-raising flour
- 150g brown soft sugar
- 200g softened butter
- 200ml of milk
- 100g mixed citrus peel
- Teaspoon of salt
- Teaspoon cinnamon

Date mix:

- 200g seedless dates
- 100g orange juice
- Gently warm in saucepan to soften dates
- Allow to cool before using.

PREPARATION:

Mix flour, sugar, cinnamon, salt and butter together, add milk and citrus peel.

- Halve mixture and Roll out on floured cutting board making 2 separate rectangles
- One is a top and the other a base

Apply a layer of date and orange mixture to cover the base of first rectangle place the top piece on.

- Cut into desired sizes of scones brush with milk
- Fan Bake for 25 minutes at 160c Serve with softened butter.
